



On May 4, 2009, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) presented Osborne Construction Company (Osborne) with the Alaska Construction Health and Safety Excellence (AKCHASE) banner as evidence of the partnership developed between the State of Alaska and Osborne.

This banner acknowledges and awards Osborne for having developed a safety culture that exceeds standards set for the construction industry by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration. To receive this award, a construction firm

must demonstrate their commitment to regulatory compliance, best management practices and a daily regimen of integrated safety and construction practices.

The submittal package presented by Osborne to Alaska OSHA was extensive and exceeded 250 pages containing policies and historical evidence, including daily crew safety meeting sign-in sheets, weekly all hands site safety meeting sign-in sheets, and monthly superintendent safety meetings.

Osborne's safety-based training includes site orientation, CPR/1<sup>st</sup> Aid, OSHA 10 hour, forklift operators, Man Lift operators, fall protection, and scaffolding training to personnel within or working under our company. Our daily safety inspections with corrective actions were included in this submittal as well.

Additionally, Osborne's program requires the company to adhere to an agreement with OSHA that provides for continuous interaction for five years.

Osborne Construction is proud to be the recipient of this award, as we have worked hard to make safety a common thread in all things we do. We continue to set the example for Construction Safety.
